Jonah

Big Idea

Jonah is full of the unexpected. It's more about a prophet than the words of God spoken through a prophet. And we see clearly that Jonah (the prophet) is a selfish, self-centered man, while those people in the story that we would expect to be ungodly (and initially some are) actually end up becoming humble and quick to repent. Jonah's sermon is so brief it almost feels like he intentionally cuts information out. This is clearly not what we're used to from the minor prophets! But God's character of grace, mercy, and love for all people is displayed; even His grace, mercy, and love for our enemies . . . for your enemies. Are you okay with that? (Jonah 4:10-11)
