Questions

- 1. What has challenged you, changed you or confused you from this week's sermon or the Scriptures in it?
- 2. These events from these chapters are great examples of how the Bible is truthful in all it reports, but it does not always *support* everything it reports. How would you explain that concept to a friend? To a child?
- 3. Which character from these chapters is striking to you, and why?
 - What would it have been like to have been one of those characters?
- 4. Which story from these chapters is striking to you, and why?
- 5. From the sermon or from these chapters in Genesis, what makes you ask questions? For instance:
 - Why did it happen like that?
 - Why would God allow that?
 - Why did he/she do that?
 - What would I have done in that situation?
 - o Etc.
- 6. Chapter 39 ends with Joseph in prison, wrongly accused and condemned. If you read just a bit further into Genesis 40:1, it says, "Some time after thisâ€i" We prefer our hard things in our lives to come to a close quickly; it is difficult for us when those hard things linger beyond "the end of the chapter"!
 - What can be learned in those times of waiting?
- 7. What can be learned about God from the events in these chapters?
 - What questions would you want to ask him?
- 8. What can be learned about humans from the events in these chapters?
- 9. What principles of godly living can be derived from the events in these chapters?
