Questions

- 1. What has challenged you, changed you or confused you from this week's sermon or the Scriptures in it?
- 2. If you were engaged in a conversation about a movie featuring demons, how might you steer the conversation to a balanced, biblical view of demonic activity?
- 3. What two (opposite) errors regarding demons & demonic activity were noted in the sermon?
- 4. Can a Christian be demon-possessed?
- 5. Read Mark 5:1-20.
- 6. Satan wants to destroy people, and we can also destroy our lives all by ourselves. Do you agree or disagree? Why?
 - What sinful desires within you would Satan use to move you towards destruction?
 - What were some ways the devil sought to destroy this man?
 - o In what ways do people today head towards their own destruction by listening to the Devil's lies?
 - The demons rightly recognized Jesus' identity. Do you see a difference between recognizing the truth that Jesus is God, and surrendering to Jesus in worship?
 - o How do you think that difference plays itself out in religious people today?
- 7. How did the people of the region react? (It seems that they valued the pigs more than the man).
 - In what ways have you seen things (possessions, control, time, being "right", etc.) valued above people in our society?
 - How have you seen that in your life?
- 8. Jesus healed this man from his destructive ways. You may have never had an unclean or evil spirit like he did, but what has Jesus healed you from?
 - How have you responded (or not responded) to Jesus' healing in your life?
 - Has His healing in your life resulted in an increased desire to be with Him?
- Who can you tell your story (of healing from the path of destruction) to this week?
