God Does Things His Way.

Scripture: Mark 8:22-9:1

Also: Mark 10:45; Psalm 115:3; 1 Corinthians 6:9-11

Questions

- 1. What has challenged you, changed you or confused you from this week's sermon or the Scriptures in it?
- 2. Read Mark 8:22-9:1. The main point of the sermon was: God has his way of working because his ways are better than any human mind could understand, and the three sub-points were:
 - God Works In Us His Way
 - God Saves Us His Way
 - God Calls Us To Follow His Way
- 3. What objections have you had to God's authority in your life (thus disrespecting His place as the Ultimate Sovereign)?
- 4. How would you respond if someone objects to the statement: "Jesus does not ask us for a lot; Jesus asks for everything"? Why? Have you ever wrestled with that thought/feeling?
 - How is Jesus' call to discipleship radical?
 - o How have we watered-down (or made less radical) what Jesus calls for in the Bible?
- 5. How would you answer a child who asked, "Why does it say Jesus must suffer, die, and rise again?" How would you answer that if a family member or friend asked you?
- 6. How does the world entice you to live a self-centered life?
- 7. Compare these two sayings:
 - "The safe life must be put to death."
 - "The safest place to be is in the middle of God's will."
 - What is the definition of "safe" in each phrase?
- 8. Read Mark 8:31-33. Jesus had to rebuke a close friend who essentially said, "Surely God doesn't want you to face this hard thing." Sometimes suffering is the very means God is using to help us develop.
 - Have you ever had to exercise caution because a friend gave you that kind of counsel?
 - Have you ever given that kind of counsel?
- Ask the Holy Spirit to help you see blind spots that you may have when it comes to comfort, discipleship, and suffering.
