Questions

- 1. What has challenged you, changed you or confused you from this week's sermon or the Scriptures in it?
- 2. The main point of the sermon was that we should never lose the desperate need for Jesus in our life.
 - How would you rate your level of desperation for Jesus? (You could use a 1-10 scale.)
 - Why would you rate it how you did?
 - What is one thing you could do this week to move more into desperation for Him?
- 3. Read Mark 9:2-13.
 - How do you think seeing Jesus in His radiant glory would affect you?
 - How do you think that would affect your understanding of and obedience to Jesus?
 - o Do you think you would be similar or different to the disciples' response? Why?
 - How does the command to listen to Jesus alone, and not Moses or Elijah, affect our view of the prophets, priests, and kings of the Old Testament?
 - Is there an area of your life that the Holy Spirit is nudging you to grow in obedience to Jesus?
- 4. Read Mark 9:14-29.
 - The father of the boy in this story seems to shift around in his faith.
 - Have you ever felt this way?
 - o Do we ever divide our lives into 2 categories: things that we need Jesus for, and things that we don't need him for?
 - If someone made the statement that, "Your prayer life is a reflection of your dependence on God" would you agree or disagree? Why?
 - How does turning to Jesus with questions and doubts demonstrate at least small faith rather than no faith at all?
 - What would having no faith look like?
 - What questions do you have for Jesus?
- Has there been a moment in your life when Jesus suddenly was revealed to you as glorious and holy God? Could you share that with someone this week?
